## AFL-CIO Craft Unions ALPA and AFA

The history and strength of unions in the United States was built around the AFL-CIO. The AFL-CIO was formed in 1955 by the merger of the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations. The American Federation of Labor-Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO) is the voluntary federation of America's unions, representing 11 million members. All of the Unions represented on the property at United Airlines belong to the AFL-CIO and their various local, state and federal councils.

## AFL-CIO Democratic Unions hold the property at UAL

These Unions have their own Locals at UAL hub stations with membership elected Officers and Representatives. There are no appointed business agents. These democratically controlled unions are accountable to their membership. The membership's dues monies and resources are available from the Locals for representation and protection.

## The Teamsters are outsiders; they do not belong to the AFL-CIO

The Teamsters left the AFL-CIO to raid other unions. The IBT has a long history of raiding other unions. Some of the most recent raids have included Hawaiian Air Cargo, Horizon Air, United Airlines, as well as other AFL-CIO Unions. Unfortunately based on the representation we have received over the last year and a half most of those members came to regret their choice to join the Teamsters. Government statistics prove this fact. The IBT lost 22,000 members in 2008.

The IBT is the most decertified Union in the USA. Union members represented by the Teamsters have decertified the IBT based on poor representation, more than any other Union in the United States.

During 2008 the Teamsters lost 22,000 union members, according to the TDU -<u>Teamsters for a Democratic Unio</u>n. **Check out their website for more information on the failures of the Teamster Union Leadership at <u>TDU.org.</u>**
